Dear Chairwoman Bledsoe:

The American Osteopathic Association (AOA) and the Arkansas Osteopathic Medical Association (AOMA) are writing in support of SB 78. This bill requires the Arkansas State Medical Board to perform an analysis of the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (Compact) to determine whether the state of Arkansas should participate. The AOA and AOMA believe that joining the Compact would ease administrative burdens for physicians interested in holding a license to practice medicine in multiple states, while allowing states to maintain control over medical licensure, discipline and patent protection.

The AOA represents nearly 130,000 osteopathic physicians (DOs) and osteopathic medical students, promotes public health, encourages scientific research, serves as the primary certifying body for DOs and is the accrediting agency for osteopathic medical schools. More information on DOs/osteopathic medicine can be found at www.osteopathic.org. AOMA is a professional organization that represents over 300 DOs providing patient care in Arkansas.

The AOA and AOMA support the intent of the Compact, as it will allow states to continue to govern activities within their borders, while encouraging states to work together to ease the burdens of holding a license in multiple states. Physician interest in holding licenses in multiple states has grown with the increasing use of telemedicine nationally. This use of technology is one way to improve patient access to care, and potentially address physician workforce shortage issues.
